What are Student Workers?

High school students who are 16 years of age or older have the opportunity to participate in the electoral process by serving as elections clerks at polling locations on Election Day. A student who is at least 16 years of age and who is enrolled in a Public or Private high school or home schooled, and has the consent of the principal (or parent/legal guardian in charge of education in Home school) may serve as an election clerk. Dallas County Elections Department must receive written authorization from the student's parent or guardian to serve in the election for which the student is selected to work.

Benefits of Serving as a clerk:

- Dallas County Election workers are paid \$12.00 or \$16.00 hourly for their service, depending on the type of election;
- Students will gain practical experience by serving their community and state;
- Experience as an election clerk is an impressive addition to a resume or college application;
- Students can take part in a rewarding activity while learning about the democratic process;
- Earn up to 19 hours of community service.

What are the Responsibilities of an Election Clerk?

- o Organizing the polling place before the polls open and close.
- o Ensuring that qualified voters are permitted to vote.
- o Checking in and processing voters and
- o Distributing ballots to registered voters.
- o Answering voters' questions

What are the Qualifications?

- Be at least 16 years old on Election Day:
- Be enrolled in a public, private, or qualified home school;
- Must be a U.S. citizen;
- Fluent in English (and Spanish to be a Bilingual Student Election Clerk);
- Be register to vote, if 18 years of age by Election Day.

Checklist:

- ✓ Fill out the <u>High School Student Election Clerk Application and Permission Slip</u>
- ✓ Have consent of his/her parent or legal guardian to work the election;
- ✓ Have consent of his/her school principal (or parent/legal guardian for home-schooled students); if
 Tuesday, November 3, 2020 is a student/teacher holiday for your school district a principal signature is not
 required.
- ✓ Complete any required election worker training program; and
- ✓ Have reliable transportation.
